


in his life. Let's peel back the layers to really learn about this incredibly inspiring and uplifting man.

After completing Infantry School, Francisco volunteered for reconnaissance training and successfully joined the 2nd Reconnaissance Battalion. He continued his upward trajectory throughout his early career, picking up more and more responsibilities as he marched forward through the ranks within various reconnaissance teams.

Francisco decided to pursue a college education in 1998, transitioning to the reserves. Throughout this schooling, Francisco remained active in the reserves, even joining the 3rd Force Reconnaissance Company and eventually becoming a team leader. On top of that, Francisco also took part in specialized training in Airborne High Altitude High Opening Operations; Survival, Evasion, Resistance, and Escape Training; and Scout Sniper School, And then he earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Information Technology - does he ever stop!?. Francisco is a walking beacon of achievement and excellence, guided by the idea that his life was meant for something greater than himself. service. It's astonishing this man's list of achievements!


